The District Industries Centre, Gajapati is mainly implementing the following schemes at District Level.

- (i) PMRY Scheme
- (ii) MSME Scheme
- (iii) RHA Scheme
- (iv) REGP Scheme

Brief spectrum of these schemes are outlined here under.

PMRY SCHEME

Prime Minister Rozgar Yojana has been launched since 2nd October 1993 by Govt. of India for providing self employment to educated unemployed youths. During the year 1993-94, it was implemented only in Urban areas. But subsequently from 1994-95 it has been extended to Rural areas also. Any economically viable activities in Industry / Service / Business Sector including Agriculture and allied activities are eligibility for financing under the Scheme excluding direct agriculture operation like raising crops, purchase of manure, etc.

The maximum limit of project cost per individual in the case of business and service sector Rs.2,00,000/- and Rs.5,00,000/0 for other activities i.e. Industry sector.

1. WHOM TO APPLY :

Eligible candidates can apply directly to concerned District Industries Centre (DIC) or through the Local Industries Promotion Officer or to the local Branch Manager of the Commercial Banks as per the relevant advertisement published during the month of April / May of every year.

2. SCHEME :

All economically viable activities in Industries / Service / Business sector is including Agriculture and allied activities are considered under PMRY Scheme, where priority is given for promotion of Industrial Ventures.

3. PROJECT COST :

Industries Project upto Rs.5.00 lakhs
Service / Business upto Rs.2.00 lakhs
Partnership Project upto Rs.10.00 lakhs
For Self Help Group (5 – 20 persons), there is no upper limit

4. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA :

Age : General Category between 18 to 35 years.
SC / ST, Ex-Serviceman / Physically Handicapped and Women Between 18 to 45 years.

Minimum Educational Qualification : Class VIII Passed

Preferences will be given to applicants trained in any trade from Govt. recognized / approved institutions for at least 6 months.

Residency :

Permanent resident of the area for at least 3 years. For married women the residency criteria apply to in laws.

Family Income :

Neither Income of the beneficiary along with the spouse nor income of parent of the beneficiary shall exceed Rs.1,00,000/- per annum.

Default to Bank / Financial Institution :

Beneficiary or parent default to any Nationalized Bank / Financial Institution / Cooperative banks are in eligible.

A person already assisted under other subsidy linked Government Scheme is also ineligible.

5. SUBSIDY :

15% of the Project Cost limited to Rs.12,500/- per entrepreneur.

6. MARGIN MONEY :

5% to 16.25% of the Project Cost.

7. COLLATERAL :

No collateral security for Projects upto Rs.2.00 lakhs for industry sector.
Rs.1.00 lakh for service and business sector, Rs.5.00 lakhs per borrowal account partnership cases.

8. RATE OF INTEREST :

Normal Bank rate of interest

9. REPAYMENT SCHEDULE :

3 to 7 years after an initial moratorium period as prescribed by Bank.

10. RESERVATION :

SC / ST – 22.5%

Other Backward Classes – 27%

In case of non availability of candidates, reserve quota would be filled up from general category.

11. CRITERIA FOR SELECTION :

Commercial viability and marketing tie-up of proposed venture in the opinion of the Task Force / Banks.

12. COUNSELING :

Group counseling is facilitated through District Industries Centre / Industries Promotion Officer.

MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES

1. CONCEPT OF INDUSTRIES

The concept of small scale industries as promulgated under Industrial Development and Regulation Act, 1951 has been changed by the Micro, Small and Medium Enterprise Development (MSMED) Act 2006 of Govt. of India w.e.f. 2nd October 2006.

The earlier concept of "Industries" has been changed to "Enterprises". The Enterprises have been classified broadly into following categories :

- a. Enterprises engaged in Manufacture / Production of goods pertaining to any Industry.
- b. Enterprises engaged in providing / rendering of services.

(A) Manufacturing Enterprises have been defined in terms of investment in plant and machinery (excluding land and buildings) and further classified into :

- Micro Enterprises – Investment upto Rs.25 lakhs
- Small Enterprises – Investment above Rs.25 lakhs and upto 5 crores.
- Medium Enterprises – Investment above 5 crores and upto Rs.10 crores.

(B) Service Enterprises have been defined in terms of their investment in equipments (excluding land and buildings) and further classified into :

- Micro Enterprises – Investment upto Rs.10 lakhs
- Small Enterprises – Investment above Rs.10 lakhs and upto 2 crores.
- Medium Enterprises – Investment above 2 crores and upto Rs.5 crores.

2. FILLING MEMORANDUM BY MSMES

Process of Two stage registration of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises dispensed with and replaced by filling of Memoranda. Filing of Memorandum is optional for all Micro and Small Enterprises and all service sector Medium Enterprises where as filing of Memorandum is mandatory for manufacturing sector medium enterprises.

ENTREPRENEURS MEMORANDUM – PART I (EM PART-I)

Any Entrepreneur proposed to undertake the enterprise can submit the EM-PART-I, after registration of which enables the entrepreneur to apply for :

- a. Financial Assistance from the Bank.
- b. Statutory NOC / License from the relevant authority.
- c. Power connection.
- d. Water connection.
- e. Govt. Land if any.
- f. Other incentives provided by the State Govt. for the enterprises in the pipeline.

ENTREPRENEURS MEMORANDUM – PART II (EM PART-II)

Any Entrepreneur after having commercial operation of the enterprise or expansion programme of existing enterprise can submit the EM-II.

3. REGISTERING AUTHORITY :

The General Manager, District Industries Centre have been authorized by the Govt. of Orissa in Industries Department with whom the Entrepreneurs Memorandum shall be filed by the entrepreneurs.

REHABILITATION OF HANDICRAFTS ARTISANS (RHA) GUIDELINES FOR AVAILING OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE BY INDIVIDUAL BENEFICIARIES UNDER THE SCHEME REHABILITATION OF HANDICRAFTS ARTISANS (RHA)

1. Name of the Scheme : Rehabilitation of Handicrafts Artisans
2. Aim of the Scheme : Providing margin money for availing bank finance for setting up individual units by handicrafts artisan. This will be provided as grant.
3. Scheme : The scheme has to be prepared for the selected artisans by the DCIO of the concerned D.I.C. The scheme will cover both working capital/Block Capital required as per necessary, skills and ability of the entrepreneur. This grant will be margin for both working capital and Block capital.
4. Eligibility :
 - a. Entrepreneur should be either form the traditional artisans of craft family or trained from any of the handicrafts training centres / school / SHMT / HCFT complex or from any other approved institutions in any of the Crafts.
 - b. Age - He / She should be within the age group of 18 to 48 years.

- c. He / She should be a permanent resident of the State of Orissa.
 - d. He/ She should be able to contribute at least 5% of the total cost of the Project.
5. Selection : There will be a committee to select the Crafts man. The committee will consist of the DCIO, Assistant Manager, (C.1) and another officer from the office of the DCIO to be co-opted by the DCIO at his discretion.
6. Limit of assistance : The amount will be maximum of Rs. 5,000/- or 25% of the loan requirement of total cost of the scheme which ever is less.
7. Release of Assistance : State grant @ 25% of loan sanctioned by the financing Institution or Rs. 5,000/- which ever is less would be released in favour of the crafts man to the bank or financing Institution who will in turn release the required amount of funds for implementation of the scheme. First the Crafts man's share 5% of the project is to be deposited in the bank after which state grant will be released.
8. Monitoring : The DCIO, of DIC will monitor for proper implementation of the Scheme. The artisan would be enrolled as member either in or of the nearby Handicraft Cooperative Society or Block level Artisans Multipurpose C.S. / Gramodyogmo Marketing CS for marketing up to sale the Craft products.

Implementing Agency :

- Application are Processed at DICs.
- Projects having cost less than Rs. 15.00 Lakh are scrutinized by District Technical Committee headed by General Manager, DIC.
- Projects having cost more than Rs. 15 lakhs are scrutinized by Appraisal committee headed by Director of Industries, Orissa.
